By working together to underpin growth and celebrate success, businesses based in Westminster can meet changing expectations, thrive responsibly, and play a vital role in helping to build a City for All.

# Westminster Lion: Recognising responsible business practice

To build a City for All, we want Westminster to be a:

- city of opportunity – a place where everyone should have the opportunity to build their lives, careers and families here
- healthier and greener city – a place where those who live and work in Westminster can enjoy clean, active and healthy lives
- city that celebrates its communities – a place where everybody has a stake in the city and are at the heart of every decision
- caring and fairer city – a place that supports the most vulnerable within our community

To recognise businesses making a positive impact in Westminster, the council developed the Westminster Lion; a programme dedicated to awarding excellence in corporate social responsibility, and giving responsible businesses the recognition and visibility they deserve for the role they play in creating a City for All.

This year, we accredited 31 businesses that demonstrated how they operate ethically and work towards our key priorities in creating a City for All.

Those organisations that demonstrated the most impressive track-record in being responsible were shortlisted for a Westminster Lion award. Winners were announced at the Business Impact Forum.

# 2018 Westminster Lion Award winners

## Environment Award

### Willmott Dixon

This award recognises the work that goes into protecting and improving the local environment and combating climate change.

As well as providing employment opportunities for local residents and volunteering with the Avenues Youth Project, Willmott Dixon is the first company in its sector to have a formal biodiversity strategy, overseen by a Biodiversity Champion. This ensures biodiversity and green spaces is incorporated into all projects.

## Small Business Award

### Odelay Films

This award recognises the impact that small to medium sized businesses can achieve proving that size does not matter when it comes to responsible business practice.

Odelay Films recognises the need for effectively training young people wanting to get into the film production industry and so created an initiative called 'The Production Trust' to arm individuals with the knowledge and skills required. So far, the course has helped 50 young people from across London, including Westminster.

## Opportunities Award

### Capital Arches Group

This award celebrates a business that has shown an outstanding commitment to reducing and removing barriers to employment for people in Westminster.

Since August 2016, Capital Arches Group has provided over 25 unemployed local candidates with employment. It has tweaked recruitment processes to better meet the needs of candidates.

## Great Neighbourhoods Award

### Grosvenor Britain and Ireland (GBI)

This award celebrates businesses that have helped make Westminster's communities more resilient through community development activities.

GBI has one of the biggest community funds in the city, designed to see the lives of people living and working in the South Westminster area improved through community-building activities. It also brings its 'living cities' philosophy to life by ensuring their projects can foster the growth of great Neighbourhoods.

## Excellence Award

### David Miller Architects

This award recognises a business's overall excellence in CSR. David Miller Architects has demonstrated, through its different initiatives, that CSR programmes are at the core of its business function. It provides classroom-based support and mentoring to young people and provides 15 week-long work placements every year that are open to all.

It has helped build great neighbourhoods by providing pro-bono support to establish social enterprises. In addition, its 'fabric first' approach ensures all designs minimise the need for energy consumption.

## Impact Award

### Baker Street Quarter Partnership

The Impact Award celebrates businesses that create social impact in Westminster through enabling other businesses and organisations to thrive responsibly.

The Baker Street Quarter Partnership's Smarter Giving programme brings together businesses with local charities and community groups, and facilitates these businesses with redirecting their CSR efforts.

By providing a consolidated waste service it has reduced the number of waste collection trips in the area by 45%. Through commitment to the local community, this organisation is proactively enabling others to become thriving responsible businesses have a positive impact in Westminster.
